Dress warmly and play Street Racket

Tennis clubs and tennis centres have to remain closed (for the time being), many tennis players are currently unable to pursue their hobby as usual. Today we show you how you can prepare for the (hopefully possible) tennis summer with Street Racket. Because Street Racket is racket sport for everyone, anytime and anywhere - without infrastructure. We like to explain how it works.

<u>Street Racket</u> is an innovative racket game from Switzerland for everyone, always and everywhere. « One of the basic principles of Street Racket is to minimise possible obstacles to play. The concept is correspondingly simple, » explains Marcel Straub, inventor and founder of Street Racket.

The courts can be marked in no time on the ground with street chalk (outdoor) or adhesive tape or court lines (indoor) in the desired size. The field consists of three squares lined up next to each other - the two outer ones are the playing fields, while the middle one serves as a kind of « net substitute ». For groups or more intensive games, the cross field (consisting of two single courts) is the actual heart of the concept. The game is played with two rackets and a soft softball. The playing material was specially designed to achieve the best possible effects. Street Racket can be played outdoors or indoors and at all ages and levels. The movement game works directly in front of the house, on the playground, in a club or - as is the case now in Corona time - within your own four walls with the family. It can be used in short sequences, for longer sessions or even complete tournaments.

Many possible uses in Kids Tennis

« Even the first attempts can result in long, motivating rallies, » says Lucien Schenk, Kids Tennis Officer at Swiss Tennis. « Especially in kids tennis, it's a wonderful way to work on the basics with racket and ball. Street Racket is like a simplified form of tennis, you don't have to play over a net yet, the rackets are lighter and you have lots of opportunities to keep the kids busy and moving with different stations during training thanks to the numerous forms of play. »

But Street Racket also brings variety and a lot of fun for experienced tennis players. Street Racket can be used to practise ball feeling and especially hand-eye coordination, and it also integrates cognitive aspects. « The players can learn motor basics through the ball contacts, such as anticipation, reaction or the ability to differentiate - that means, for example, that a fast ball can be distinguished from a slow one, which then naturally requires a different rebound. In addition, exciting thinking processes and perception games can be integrated into our activities, » says Marcel Straub.

Fun games played with distance

Especially now - with a lot of screen time and a lack of training and compensation opportunities - Street Racket can provide positive impulses. Studies show that the rhythmic rallies can help curb myopia. « Playing street racket outside in the fresh air every day strengthens the immune system and helps reduce frustration, aggression and depression », Marcel Straub is convinced. So, dress warmly and play Street Racket...
